Some business that was attended to at the board meeting included a recap of the Summer Organ Encounter for young people interested in playing the organ. We helped support it financially this summer and plan to increase that support to a cap of \$500 next summer. This is an extension of the SOE that has been happening in Grand Rapids for a number of years and is the second summer it has been offered in Holland. Each participant receives three private lessons on three different organs and they give a recital at the end. Those receiving the scholarships audition and must have some keyboard facility. It is encouraging that seven students took part this year.

The board voted to discontinue monitoring AGO exams. The person who volunteered to do this is no longer a member of our chapter.

National AGO requested money from us for the Annual Fund, and we voted to increase this to \$100.

Understanding AGO's Renewal Timeline – Guidance from AGO Headquarters:

<u>Three Months Before Your Expiration Date</u> An invoice is created for your next membership year. "Renew Dues and Subscriptions" appears on your ONCARD menu. Your status changes to "invoiced not paid" on your chapter's member roster. A renewal notice is sent from headquarters, either by email or postal mail depending on your preferences.

<u>Two Months Before Your Expiration Date</u> A second renewal notice is sent from headquarters, either by email or postal mail depending on your preferences.

One Month Before Your Expiration Date A third renewal notice is sent from headquarters by postal mail.

<u>2 Weeks Before Your Expiration Date</u> Chapter officers receive notification of all members who have not yet renewed.

Bill Due Date AGO dues payments are due on the last day of the month before expiration.

Expiration Date: Always the First of the Month A membership expires, and a two week grace period begins at the time of expiration.

<u>Two Weeks After the Expiration Date</u> The grace period ends and memberships are marked canceled. If a payment is received after this date, delivery of *The American Organist* may be delayed.
